



**Minutes of Tower Grove Heights Neighborhood Association Meeting – May 23, 2017**  
**Convened: 7:15 p.m. Adjourned: 8:15 p.m. 20 attendees**

- Three first-time attendees were recognized and given Welcome Packets. Welcome to all!*

- **Neighborhood business/announcements**

- **SLMPD 2<sup>nd</sup> District Liaison Officer, Ed Slade** ([edslade@slmpd.org](mailto:edslade@slmpd.org))

- *Officer Slade provided two handouts on area crime stats (see attachments).*
    - *Other than robberies, most other crime is down in our area.*
    - *One suspect is in custody from last year's incident on 3600-3700 Wyoming in which the victims were returning from Chicago with their young children and were robbed at gunpoint. There is not enough evidence to hold the other suspect, Officer Slade reported.*
    - *There is no info on the homicide that occurred on the 3800 block of Juniata other than what was previously reported.*

- **15<sup>th</sup> Ward Aldermanic report, Megan Green** (314-591-9587 or [megan@meganellyiagreen.com](mailto:megan@meganellyiagreen.com))

- *There will be a public meeting about the proposed development at 3172 Morgan Ford (currently, the site of "C Wash N Cruise" self-serve carwash) on May 31, 6:30 p.m. at Oak Hill Presbyterian Church. TGS resident, Rob Maltby, and his two business partners are proposing a 3-story, 26-unit apartment building with 6,000sf of street-level retail. Rents for the one- and two-bedroom units will range from \$1,000 - \$1,250/month.*
    - *RE: Recent property tax assessment: Megan reports that we have been undervalued so this assessment, which increased taxes on some area properties by as much as thirty percent, is an attempt by the assessor's office to bring amounts in line with actual value. Green admits it would have been better if there had been a more incremental rise. She doesn't know the effect of the Hancock Amendment vis-à-vis this latest reassessment. She says the reassessment hit Wards 15, 8 and 6 hardest but it helps average out some of the lower-priced areas of the city.*
    - *Next round of LED lighting will cover the 3900 blocks to Gravois.*
    - *Coming speed humps: The 15<sup>th</sup> Ward will be the third ward to test this traffic-calming method.*

- **Featured Speaker: Bill Reininger, Director of Tower Grove Park** ([breininger@towergrovepark.org](mailto:breininger@towergrovepark.org))

- *A landscape architecture and planning firm in Alexandria, VA, Rhodeside and Harwell, that has experience with historic parks was brought in to do an assessment of the park. (The last Master Plan for the park was conducted in 1985.) Because Tower Grove Park is on both the National Register of Historic Places in St. Louis and the National Historic Landmarks in Missouri, there are some restrictions about what changes can be made without jeopardizing that status.*
    - *To gather information from area stakeholders, a Citizens Advisory Committee (CAC) was created which includes representatives of surrounding neighborhood associations. (TGHNA President Barbara Gilchrist is involved.)*
    - *An Open House was conducted.*

- *In a survey that yielded 1300 responses, 98 percent of respondents indicated trees were important to them. There were 68 suggestions for new activities in the park.*
- *The next public meeting will be held in July. Details to follow.*
- *Cypress Circle has been repaired; restrooms will be updated; eight pickleball courts will be installed. The water feature is up and running.*
- *Their new website and map launches tomorrow ([www.towergrovepark.org](http://www.towergrovepark.org)). Pavilions can now be booked through the new online reservation system.*
- *The park is now “mobile ready.” For example, from their smart phones, visitors can access GPS-enabled information about each tree including the Tribute Trees, among many other facts as they walk about the park grounds.*
- *As funding becomes available, the park will interview design firms to implement specific projects.*
- *The City of St. Louis received a federal grant, Transportation Alternative Plan (TAP grant) to pay for the design and implementation of improved access to the park.*
- *The staff worked with the Saint Louis University School of Business to determine what the park provides to the community. It was found that the park is an economic driver, not just an amenity.*
- *Due to the recent sales tax drop, Tower Grove Park (along with the other five parks that receive monies from this tax) will receive about \$96,000 less.*
- *Although they have received volunteer help from such entities as Monsanto and the Boy Scouts, they are seeking additional volunteer help. Sign up to volunteer on their website.*
- *Rangers are in the park 24/7.*
- *In response to a resident’s question about the lights being out one night recently, Reininger stated that construction crews had hit a power line but repairs were made.*
- *In response to a resident’s question about former director, John Karel, Reininger stated Karel is doing well in Ste. Genevieve, MO.*
